F. A. Parker, F. Watson, J. Watson, P. Gorman and Martin, of this district. first wife passed away years since and eight years ago he contracted a second marriage and leaves a widow to mourn the loss of a kind and indulgent husband.

The late Mr. Forward was very widely connected, amongst other relations being a nephew in the person of Mr. A. W. Byfield, Mayor of Northam. The funeral is appointed to leave his late residence, on Grass Valley road, at one o'clock this afternoon, arriving at St John's Church at 2 30 o'clock, thence proceeding to the Anglican portion of the Northam cemetery.
