OLD COLONIST'S DEATH.

Miss Eleanor Edwards, an old colonist, whose grandfather, William Edwards, a Waterloo veteran, arrived in this State 99 years ago on the Rockingham, died at her home in Claremont on Saturday. Miss Edwards, who was in her 86th year, was born at Guildford, and she was the eldest of a family of 10. She spent the greater part of her life in York and took an active interest in Church work.
