

Death of Mr Geo Hillier, Senr.

Mr Geo Hillier, senr., an old and well-known identity of the Tatiara, passed away at the residence of his son-in-law, (Mr Jas Gillies) on Thursday night. The deceased was in his 81st year. The remains are to be interred at the Mundalla cemetery to-morrow (Saturday) afternoon, leaving the residence at 2 o'clock and arriving at the cemetery at about 3.
