## DEATH OF MRS JOHANNAH ALLINGTON.

The death occurred at Irishtown on Saturday last of Mrs Johannah Allington, relict of the late George Allington. The deceased who had reached the age of 76 years was a native of Tasbert Limerick Ireland. She with her husband were amongst the early and successful pioneers of the Irishtown district, having come to the State 56 years ago, and has lived for the past 43 years at Green Station. She had been married 43 years, and her husband pre-deceased her four years ago. The deceased left three children, Mr John Allington, Northam, Mrs H. Watson, and Miss Mary Allington, besides a large number of other relatives, to mourn sad bereavement. The funeral took place on Sunday afternoon and was largely attended. The remains were first conveyed to St. Joseph's Church, Northam, where the Rev Father O'Donnell conducted the first portion of the burial service. The cortege then reformed and proceeded to the Roman Catholic portion of the Northam Cemetery, where the rev. gentleman again officiated. The chief mourners were Mr J.
