

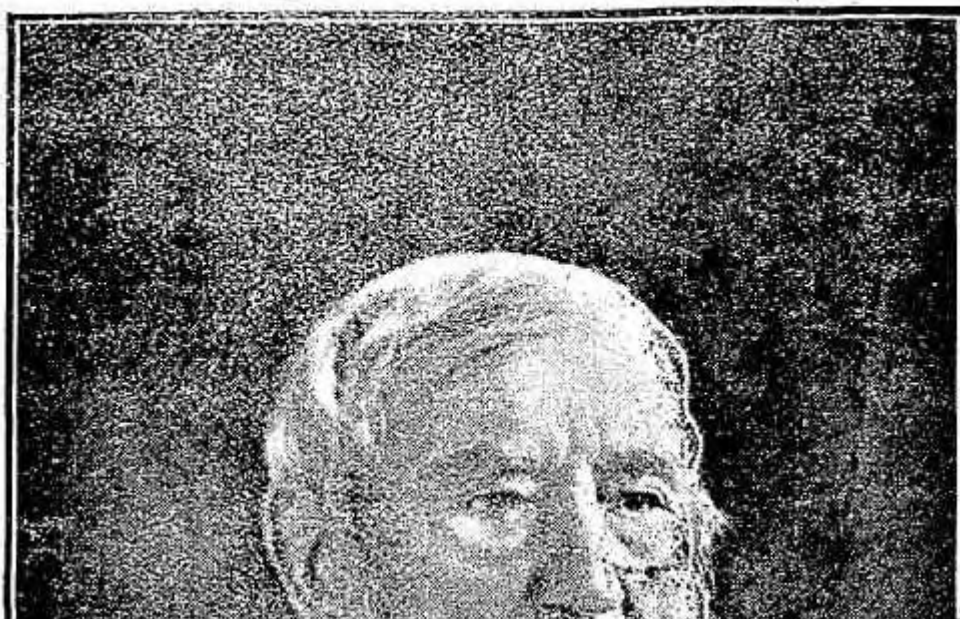
Death of Mr. W. Marwick, Senr.

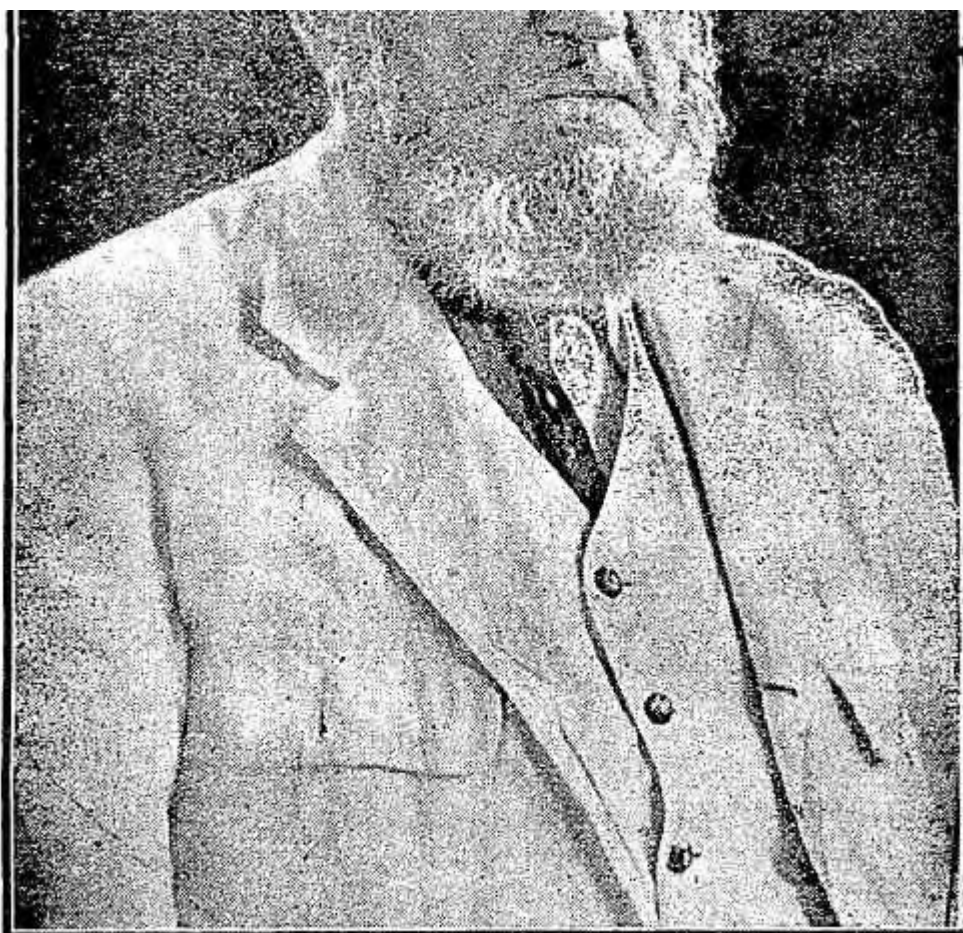
An Old West Australian Identity
